*Isaiah 42: 1-9*

**A reading from the prophet Isaiah:**

Here is my servant, whom I uphold,  
my chosen, in whom my soul delights;  
I have put my spirit upon him;  
he will bring forth justice to the nations.  
He will not cry out or lift up his voice  
or make it heard in the street;  
a bruised reed he will not break,  
and a dimly burning wick he will not quench;  
he will faithfully bring forth justice.  
He will not grow faint or be crushed  
until he has established justice in the earth,  
and the coastlands wait for his teaching.  
Thus says God, the LORD,  
who created the heavens  
and stretched them out,  
who spread out the earth  
and what comes from it,

who gives breath to the people upon it  
and spirit to those who walk in it:  
I am the LORD; I have called you in  
righteousness;  
I have taken you by the hand and kept you;  
I have given you as a covenant to the people,  
a light to the nations,  
to open the eyes that are blind,  
to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon,  
from the prison those who sit in darkness.  
I am the LORD; that is my name;  
my glory I give to no other,  
nor my praise to idols.  
See, the former things have come to pass,  
and new things I now declare;  
before they spring forth,  
I tell you of them.

## Presentation of the Candidates

*Celebrant:*

The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

*Parents & Godparents:*

I present Benedict Bomar Katzenmiller to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

*Celebrant to Parents & Godparents:*

Will you be responsible for seeing that this child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

*Parents & Godparents:*

I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant:*

Will you by your prayers and witness help Benedict grow into the full stature of Christ?

*Parents & Godparents:*

I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant asks candidate or parents and godparents who speak on behalf of infants and younger children:*

*Question:* Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

*Answer:* I renounce them.

*Question:* Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

*Answer:* I renounce them.

*Celebrant to congregation:* Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Benedict in his life in Christ?

*People*

We will.

*Celebrant:* Let us join with Benedict who is being committed to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

## Baptismal Covenant

*Celebrant:* Do you believe in God the Father?

*People:* I do.

*Celebrant:* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

*People:* I do.

*Celebrant:* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

*People:* I do.

<i>Celebrant:</i>	Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?	<i>People:</i>	I will, with God's help.
<i>Celebrant:</i>	Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?	<i>People:</i>	I will, with God's help.
<i>Celebrant:</i>	Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?	<i>People:</i>	I will, with God's help.
<i>Celebrant:</i>	Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?	<i>People:</i>	I will, with God's help.
<i>Celebrant:</i>	Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?	<i>People:</i>	I will, with God's help.

## Prayers for Candidates

*Celebrant to congregation:* Let us now pray for Benedict, who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

<i>Leader:</i>	Open his heart to your grace and truth.	<i>People</i>	Lord, hear our prayer.
<i>Leader:</i>	Fill him with your holy and life-giving Spirit.	<i>People</i>	Lord, hear our prayer.
<i>Leader:</i>	Keep him in the faith and communion of your holy Church.	<i>People</i>	Lord, hear our prayer.
<i>Leader:</i>	Teach him to love others in the power of the Spirit.	<i>People</i>	Lord, hear our prayer.
<i>Celebrant:</i> Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who live and reigns now and for ever more. <i>Amen.</i>			

## Thanksgiving over Water

<i>Celebrant blesses water:</i>	We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John.
<i>Celebrant touching water:</i>	Now sanctify this water, we pray, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. <i>Amen.</i>

## Baptism

*Candidates presented by name to Celebrant, priest, or deacon, who immerses, or pours water upon candidate saying*

*Celebrant:* Benedict, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.*

*Bishop or Priest prays over candidate.*

*Celebrant:* Let us pray. Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin and have raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. *Amen*

*Bishop or Priest places hand on candidate's head, marking forehead with sign of the cross using Chrism.*

*Celebrant* Benedict, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. *Amen.*

*Celebrant* Let us welcome the newly baptized.

*All* We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

*As newly baptized is presented to congregation, the People exchange the peace.*
